



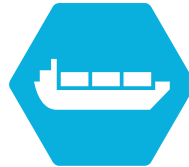
Key Facts About Delaware's Infrastructure

4 public-use airports in Delaware



\$12.25 million of unmet needs for its parks system

879 bridges, 4.4% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



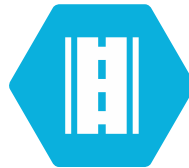
14.4 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #31 nationally

There are 83 dams in Delaware, 63 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 65% have an Emergency Action Plan



243 miles of rail across the state, ranking #48 by mileage nationally

\$1.74 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



6,452 miles of public roads, with 19% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$487 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

15 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$102 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Delaware

100 of inland waterways, ranking #31 nationally



8,465,452 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

13 miles of levees in Delaware in the National Levee Database



\$206 million in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
