



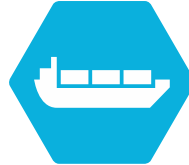
Key Facts About Georgia's Infrastructure

98 public-use airports in Georgia



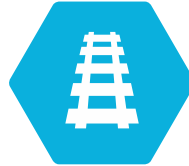
\$123 million of unmet needs for its parks system

14,863 bridges, 4.7% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



37.6 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #22 nationally

There are 5,306 dams in Georgia, 630 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 62% have an Emergency Action Plan



4,607 miles of rail across the state, ranking #7 by mileage nationally

\$21.89 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



128,355 miles of public roads, with 5% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$275 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

16 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



150,914,330 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

720 of inland waterways, ranking #14 nationally



\$2.7 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years

21 miles of levees in Georgia in the National Levee Database
