



Key Facts About South Carolina's Infrastructure

53 public-use airports in South Carolina



\$220 million of unmet needs for its parks system

9,341 bridges, **9.9%** of which were structurally deficient in 2017



20.3 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #28 nationally

There are 2,343 dams in South Carolina, 359 of which are highhazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 78% have an Emergency Action Plan



2,278 miles of rail across the state, ranking #31 by mileage nationally

\$833 million in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years





77,364 miles of public roads, with 18% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$557 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

26 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List





\$90 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in South Carolina

480 of inland waterways, ranking #19 nationally





11,516,892 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

18 miles of levees in South Carolina in the National Levee Database
